

What's New With Amateur Radio


How do you make a 3000 plus kilometer contact on 443 Mhz? In the case of Garry, ZD7GWM, 35 watts and a vertical. A new record was set by a pair of hams on October 16th when they successfully made contact between Plumstead South Africa and St. Helena Island. Now admittedly Tom, ZS1TA, has an eight element BiQuad Yagi on an Az/El Rotor, but even then - a few miles short of a 2000 mile contact (3136km) is still a major achievement. What makes this contact interesting is Garry was using a Diamond Vertical at only 20 feet!

Its thought that a marine duct was the major factor in the possibility of this contact as the image to the right shows. This duct opens regularly and although this is the longest by far, 2500 km contacts are not uncommon between South Africa and the island. In November of 2018 contact was made between Garry and Kobus, ZS3JPY, on 145.500 Mhz, both on verticals with 50 watts of power. You can check out a recording of that contact here on E17GL's blog. You ready for the kicker?

All of these contacts were done via **FM simplex** not SSB!



A month ago I (kwIa) sent an email in regards to the \$50 fee for an amateur radio license application. If the new FCC proposed rules are adopted, applications for new licenses, renewal and upgrades to existing licenses, and vanity call sign requests will now all have a fee associated. Excluded from this fee are applications for administrative updates, such as changes of address, and annual regulatory fees. The deadline was November 16 to comment and November 30 to post reply to comments. The ARRL had even prepared a Guide for those who wished to do so. Unfortunately not many comments were submitted, even though the league and other amateurs pushed hard to get every licensed amateur to voice their opinion.

The FCC proposal is contained in a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking, MD Docket 20-270, which was adopted to implement portions of the "Repack Airwaves Yielding Better Access for Users of Modern Services Act" of 2018 — the so-called "Ray Baum's Act." The Act requires that the FCC switch from a Congressionally-mandated fee structure to a cost-based system of assessment. The FCC proposed instating application fees for a broad range of services that use the FCC's ULS including the Amateur Radio Service. The current 2018 statute excludes the Amateur Service from annual regulatory fees, but not from application fees.

"Applications for personal licenses are mostly automated and do not have individualized staff costs for data input or review," the FCC said in its NPRM. "For these automated processes — new/major modifications, renewal, and minor modifications — we propose a nominal application fee of \$50 due to automating the processes, routine ULS maintenance, and limited instances where staff input is required."

The same \$50 fee would apply to all Amateur Service applications, including those for vanity call signs. "Although there is currently no fee for vanity call signs in the Amateur Radio Service, we find that such applications impose similar costs in aggregate on Commission resources as new applications and therefore propose a \$50 fee," the FCC said. The Ray Baum's Act does not exempt filing fees in the Amateur Radio Service. The FCC dropped assessment of fees for vanity call signs several years ago.

The FCC is not proposing to charge for administrative updates, such as mailing address changes for amateur applications, and amateur radio will remain exempt from annual regulatory fees. "For administrative updates [and] modifications, which also are highly automated, we find that it is in the public interest to encourage licensees to update their [own] information without a charge," the FCC said.

The FCC also proposes to assess a \$50 fee for individuals who want a printed copy of their license. "The Commission has proposed to eliminate these services — but to the extent the Commission does not do so, we propose a fee of \$50 to cover the costs of these services," the FCC said.

Quick Tips

Since were switching back from Zoom to FreeConferenceCall.com I thought a walkthrough on how to set up an account and install the program would be a good tip. Sorry for the inconvenience but the meetings should go a lot smoother if I'm not racing the clock.

Frist things first you need to make an account if you haven't already. Navigate to www.freeconferencecall.com, enter an email and password and click create my account. There is also an option to sign in with your facebook or google account, just click the button. Once your logged in on the dashboard you should see a 'download app' button. You can also find the app in the IOS and Android app stores. Just search for 'freeconferencecall' one word. If you can't download the app you can use the browser version but features are limited and I suggest you download the app instead.

Now that you have the app installed and running, click the gear icon on the bottom left and then click profile. Fill in your email and password or log in via google, facebook, etc. Once it says your logged in, click on the home button on the top left and click join.

Once you click join put in the name you would like displayed during the meeting. This can be your name, call sign or both. Fill in your

email if its not already filled in and put "sjvara" in the

meeting id section. Click join and then click "join with computer audio" (if on the mobile app tap "call in using WiFi or data"). That's it!

You should be in the room and see others that are also waiting. If you don't see anyone check the spelling on the meeting id, capitalization does matter. If you have any questions let me know and ill do my best to help. –kblzpp




